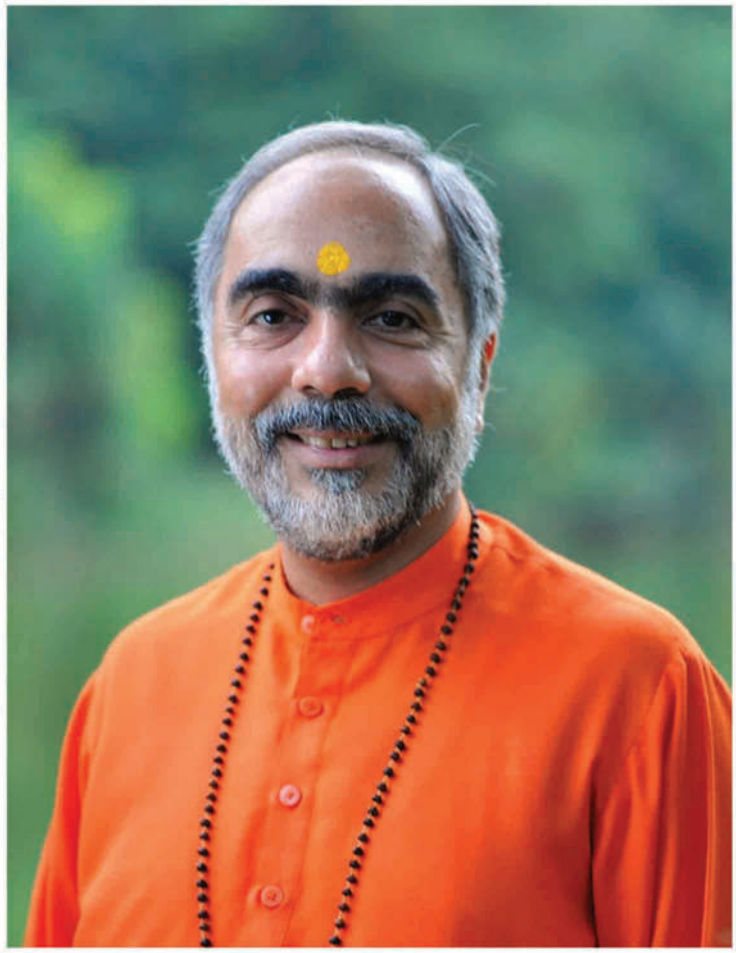

GENERAL INFORMATION AND RULES & REGULATIONS

1. AFFILIATION

Our Viyalaya is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

II. SCHOOL CURRICULUM

a) KINDERGARTEN:

In the K.G. Section, a revolutionnary change has been introduced breaking a new ground. This is quite in line with the thinking of modern educational psychologists as also in conformity with the UNICEF and WHO suggestions, emphasizing Ready to study skills (123 nos) Communication Skills (15 Nos) Life Skills (11 Nos) and Value based Education with a thrust given on environment and nature study.

b) E-learning with interactive board based on the latest technology is introduced from the academic year 2010-2011 onwards. (from LKG-X)

c) The curriculam for all calsses is prescribed by the Cental Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

E). TEXT BOOKS, NOTE BOOKS ETC.

The school arranges the supply of all text books note books, badges and belts. Parents are requested to obtain these only from the school to ensure uniformity.

III). EXTRA -CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES.

A number of extracurricular activities have been introduced which are designed to develop all around personality of the students. Science Club, Seed Club, Social Science Club, Mathematics club, literary Club, Health club, Dance club and Computer Science Club are also functioning. The school has started a unit of the Association of the Kasaragod Amateur Taek wondo (Korean Marital Art) for girls and boys in the campus. Karate and skating also have been introduced in our school.

IV SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

General proficiency prizes are awarded to the best performing students for all the classes. Scholarships are also awarded to the meritorious students in association with CCMT Education Cell, Coimbatore and a few sponsors.

V). ADMISSIONS AND WITHDRAWALS

The minimum age for admission to LKG and Std. I is as per the government norms. Parents desirous of getting their children admitted to the school are requested to get them registered and obtain the application form. Registration however is no guarantee of admission. The child has to sit for an admission test and appear for an interview on the appointed date and time except in the case of LKG admissions. For admission to LKG and I std, an interview with the parents and wards are in force. Admission will be on first come first base.

Students of UKG who have successfully completed their KG course should seek fresh admission in Std I.

For this the parents should adhere to the admission date schedule notified by the school. Non adherence can imply that the ward does not need the seat in Std. I. Application forms duly filled in may be submitted on or before the stipulated date along with the original birth certificate and a xerox copy of it. A Copy of Adhar Card also has to be submitted on the admission time.

New admissions from other states/boards should bring their transfer certificate duly countersigned by the authorities concerned. They must be introduced personally by their parents/guardians who will be responsible for their regularity of attendance and payment of fees. Right of admission is reserved with the management and the decision of the management in this regard is final.

Admission to the higher classes is subject to the availability of seats, performance in the admission test and production of T.C. duly countersigned by the educational officer concerned. T.Cs produced from foreign countries must be countersigned by the Indian embassy of the country concerned.

Transfer certificate will be given only on the basis of a written application to be submitted at least a week in advance by the parent/ guardian . However if a letter regarding the urgency is produced from the school where the student is seeking admission Transfer certificate will be issued on the third day of application. It will be issued however only to those who have fully settled their dues. The management of Chinmaya Vidyalaya has decided to collect the following fee from students who will take T.C. during the academic session.

First 7 working days	- Fee for one month
Between 8 th and 15 th working day	- 1 month Tuition fee & special fee
16 th working day onwards	- Term fee & special fee

HOWEVER FEES ONCE PAID WILL NOT BE REFUNDED

VI. EXAMINATIONS AND HOLIDAYS

The Viyalaya follows CBSE norms for conducting examination from Standard I-X. For the classes from I-X there will be three term examinations probably in the month of September, December and March. Besides there will be two periodic tests between each term.

For Standard X, there will be pre- board Exams in addition prior to the Board Exam. Ordinarily, the session commences in the first week of June and ends on 31st March. There will be about one week holidays each during Onam and Christmas, and two months summer vacations in April and May, besides other public holidays as notified. There will be regular classes in April/May for classes IX & X. Attendance is compulsory.

VII Rules of Promotion

The promotion of a student to the next higher standard depends on his/her overall performance during the entire session. Since due credit is given to projects/ oral work, assignments (written and oral), periodic tests, 1st term, 1st term and 3rd term examinations, it is very essential that the students take all the tests and complete all assignments on time. If a student is absent for any of the above, he/she will forfeit the marks allotted. Re-tests or reassignments will not be held.

For, a pass from one standard to the next higher standard, a student must get atleast 33% marks in each subject or the total performance as arrived at in the last column in the progress report. The decision of the school authorities in the matter of promotion shall be final. A student who fails twice in the same class will be asked to leave the school.

FOR CLASS VI TO X

School will conduct Annual Examinations for 80 marks in each subject covering 100% syllabus of the subject.

Students have to secure 33% of marks out of 80 marks in all subjects.

NB:- Students have to secure 33% marks out of overall 20 marks (Internal Assessment) earmarked for each

subject. Internal Assessments will be made by periodic tests, notebook sub missions and subject enrichment activity and multiple assessment. (NB: Applicable to Classes I-X)

FOR CLASS X (BOARD EXAMINATION)

Remodelled assessment structure effective from the academic year 2017-18

Board will conduct class X examinations for 80 marks in each subject covering 100% syllabus of the subject.

Students have to secure 33% marks out of 80 marks in all subjects.

Both marks and grades will be awarded for individual subjects.

C.B.S.E follows positional grading to award the grades in Board examination

Progress report has to be duly signed by the parents after every examination on the day/session. The YESUHs of the 3rd Term Examination for the classes 1-VIII be published in the first or 2nd week of April.

IX School Hours

L.K.G to V : 9.30 a m to 4pm (Monday to Friday)

VI to VIII : 9.30 a m to 4pm (Monday to Saturday)

IX, X : 8.40 a m to 4pm (Monday to Saturday)

(N.B. Special classes may be held during holidays with advance intimation.)

X School Discipline

The following rules of discipline are to be strictly followed.

1. The Vidyalyaya Diary should be brought to the school everyday including examination days.
2. Students must be in the Vidhyalaya premises 5 minutes before the first bell. Late comers are not permitted to enter the class without the principal's permission.
3. Uniform defaulters will be dealt strictly. (Nb: Students are not allowed to be in T Shirt, Shorts and fashionable attire including on birthdays. It is mandatory to wear uniform on all formal occasions and special class days.
4. Campus language is only English and defaulters will be taken appropriate action
5. It is our culture to greet teachers and non teaching staff members or any other person involved in the Vidyalyaya enunciating HARI OM! by joining palms.
6. When a teacher/ distinguished visitor enters the class, students should stand up, greet him/ her saying HARI OM by joining palms.
7. Gold jewellery or any other valuable items should not be brought to the vidyalaya. Unauthorized books, magazines, toys or other articles are not to be brought to the vidyalaya. Only students of Std. V and above can wear wrist watches.

8. Students are not allowed to meet parents or visitors or to leave the school premises during school hours without prior permission of Principal.
9. Students are responsible for the safety of their personal belongings like books, writing materials and lunch boxes.
10. Students are strictly forbidden to write or scribble on school walls or furniture or disfigure the class rooms or damage any property. Parents/ Guardians will have to compensate for any such damages done to school property by their wards. Moreover, disciplinary action may also be taken against them.
11. Parents are requested not to give any money to their children without specific purpose.
12. Students having full day session should preferably bring lunch from home. Mid - day meal is arranged for students at nominal rate. They should not leave the school campus during the recess time without the prior permission from the principal.
13. Giving tips/gifts to the school staff is against the norms of the vidyalaya.
14. Every student must take part in school games and CCA classes. Weekly Balavihar classes are compulsory for the students from class I- IV.
15. While going to / coming from the assembly, PT or any other classes, or to the hall, students should walk in line silently.

16. Students upto Std IV should use only pencil. They should be regular in submitting home work assignments. Parents are requested to ensure regularity in submission of home work by their wards.
17. A record of the address of parents/guardians is maintained in the vidyalaya office. Any change of address or telephone number should be communicated to the vidyalaya without delay.
18. Parents are requested to co-operate with the school work taking due interest in the progress of their children and enforcing regularity, punctuality and discipline. Parents should check the school diary daily and ensure that the homework assigned is completed by the children. In addition parents should sign for all remarks and information given in the diary.
19. Parents/guardians/escorts are not allowed to walk into any classrooms. They may leave their wards at the school gate/varandah from where the Ayaahs will escort them into the respective class (wherever necessary)
20. Parents who wish to speak to the class teacher regarding the progress of their children shall do so only after school hours between 4.00 and 4.20 p.m. On working hours, parents can meet the teachers with the prior permission of principal in case of emergency.
21. No private tuition by the Vidyalaya staff will be permitted. Parents are requested not to approach teachers directly.

22. It is essential that all parents attend the Open Day Session whenever held.
23. To inculcate values in our children, we observe and celebrate Mathrupooja, Grand parents Day and parents day.
24. Children are not permitted to sport “MEHANDI” beyond inside the palm.
- 25 Students are not allowed to bring MOBILE PHONES/Pen Drives/Cameras into the campus either on working days or holidays. Violators will be sternly dealt with and such things will be confiscated and will not be returned. This is a strict order from the management to the students.
- 26 (i) A student whose birthday is to be celebrated may gift a new book/books or plants to the school.

(ii)He/she will be permitted to wear colour dress. It should be decent and modest in all respect.

(iii) Chocolates are strictly banned in the school campus. Students are not permitted to bring chocolates in connection with birthday celebrations.
- 27 Entrusting a child to the Vidyalaya implies that parents agree to adhere rules and regulations of the Vidyalaya. They are requested to see that their children also abide these regulations.
- 28 Students should chant the school prayer and other prescribed songs and anthems.
- 29 Plastic carry bags are prohibited in the campus.

30 Identity cards will be issued from the Vidyalaya. Students should wear the identity card on all working days and on other formal occasions including special class days etc. Identity card should be worn from home till back home.

XII Leave application

1. Leave of absence is not granted except on written application provided in the School Diary, from parent or guardian. In case of long leave on grounds of illness a medical certificate will have to be produced along with a separate leave application.
2. Students of class X should meet the principal along with their parents on the day they come to the school after their absence.
3. Children will not be allowed to go home during class hours except in case of death in the family, casualty, reporting sick on the campus or such exigencies. Students will not be allowed to attend weddings or temple functions during lunch break once they come to school.
4. A student being absent continuously without leave application for more than 15 working days will be removed from the rolls. Re admission will entail payment of a penalty of Rs. 200/-
5. Students must be present in the school on the re-opening day. Absentees after any long holidays will have to produce Medical Certificate, if such leave is not got sanctioned in advance.

6. No student suffering from contagious or infectious diseases will be allowed to attend the Vidyalyaya. A student returning to school after suffering from such a disease should produce a fitness certificate from a registered Medical practitioner.

XIII Library

Library periods are included in the time table and students of class III and above will be issued books from the library.

Students should maintain a record of the extra readings done by them, in a separate note book. This will be scrutinised by the librarian.

XIV Uniforms

The following are the details of the uniform proposed for the various classes.

GIRLS

1. Frock – Blue and Grey one piece. No belt. Badge left pocket area. Short, ankle length socks with one grey stripe. White ribbon or white hair band, black shoes.

- a. Light blue plain shirt and Grey undivided/divided skirt
 - b. Belt
 - c. Short ankle length socks with 1 grey stripe and black shoes.

d. Badge on left sleeve

e. White ribbon/ White hairband

III VI XII Salwar Kameez

-a Light Blue with Grey Jacket Front, one Piece Kameez

-b Grey Salwar

-c. No belt

-d. Short ankle length socks with grey stripe and black shoes

-e. Badge on left sleeve

-f. White ribbon and White hairband

BOYS

1. PREE-KG, L.K.G & U.K.G

Shirt and half trousers. Blue shirt with grey piping on sleeves and front pockets. White socks with one grey stripe belt, Badge on the front pocket of shirt.

II. I-V-1 Shirt and Half Trousers

a. Light Blue shirt with Grey piping on sleeves and front pocket

b. Grey Half Trousers with single pleat and flap over back pockets and side pockets

c. Belt

d. Badge on the shirt pocket

e. Black school shoes with laces and plain white socks above ankle.

III VI-XIII Light Blue shirt and grey full Trousers

- a. Blue shirt with Grey piping on sleeves and front left pocket
- b. Grey full trousers with single pleat & flap over back pockets and side pockets.
- c. Belt
- d. Badge on the front pockets of the shirt
- e. Black school shoes with laces and plain white socks

On Wednesdays students from Pre L.K.G - XII should be in squad uniform. Squad selection will be done once in two years.

N.B. (a) Girls of all classes having long (shoulder-length or more) hair should plait it into two and tie with white ribbons.

b) During rainy season, including Wednesdays, black, (Single colour) rain proof sandals, should be used by all students of Classes-X, Colour sandals will not be permitted.

c) For boys, banian with half sleeves is a must from class I onwards, as an undergarment.

d) Hall/Full formal trousers are allowed. Low waist is strictly prohibited.

XIX Payment of Fees

Tuition fee is payable for 3 terms of 4 months each

Payment of fees is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. The last date for payment of fees 1st term fee without fine is the 15th of June, 2nd term 15th September and 3rd term 15th December. Those who do not pay the fees with a fine of Rs.20 within 10 days after the due date are liable to pay an additional cumulative fine of Rs.10/- per day thereafter, including holidays. However, such remittance will be entertained only till the last working day of the month. Failure to pay the fees by the last working day of the month will lead to removal of the student from the rolls. Readmissions thereafter will entail payment of Rs.200/-

XX Mode of Payment

All fees will be collected at the school fee counter up to 1.00 p.m during working days except Saturday. On Saturdays collection will be upto 11.30 am only. We also accept payment by G-Pay, Account Transfer and AMSERP (School app)

XXI Parental Counselling

The School arranges counselling session for parents at least once or twice in a year. Eminent counsellors will be arranged for this purpose. The attendance of parents at the counselling session is compulsory

N.B:- The Management reserves the right to amend, modify or add to any of these rules and regulations of the Vidyalaya from time to time
